1. President's review of the year

We have had a fabulous 6 months despite the challenges and we are looking forward to our 25th Anniversary Ball and the exciting 2021/22 year ahead. I would like to wish all our members all the very best for a happy and healthy year ahead and I look forward to seeing you at our AGM.

2. Membership

The membership year of 2020, as we all know, has been an unusual year. Membership enrolments were nil from the beginning of Chinese New Year, which was in late January 2020, until early August. As a result of the worldwide pandemic and extenuating circumstances causing many expatriates to repatriate or prevent them from entering China, we proposed a temporary amendment to the Constitution on Article 2.2 and 2.3 relating to membership from the middle of August 2020. The amendment meant that Associate membership, open to any nationalities apart from the UK, should not exceed 45% of the total membership base and this was ratified by our members.

The total number of members for the calendar year of 2020 was 275. We had 107 families with 205 adults and 70 children. We have maintained 60% Full Membership and 40% Associate Membership which is within our amended constitution of 55% and 45% respectively.

Our membership fee was at RMB300 until June 30th and reduced to RMB200 thereafter. We started our membership renewals from 1st November 2020 and any new members who joined from then onwards could join 2021 and get November and December 2020 free. Our annual Christmas lunch saw a surge of expatriates wanting to join us.

James Dyson, who is our Website co-ordinator, repatriated and as a Committee, a decision was taken to extend him an honorary membership so we can have his continued support on the Brits Abroad Website and App.

Membership sign-up was available at all Meet and Greet Coffee Mornings, May I, Mahjong and many other Brits Abroad events.

This year our membership cards had '25th Anniversary' printed on them to remind members and build excitement for this special year. This year we decided to give only one membership card per family to be more environmentally friendly.

As part of membership, we had an active WeChat group maintained for all members where we posted events and exchanged news that would help the wider membership community.


Ellis-Hardy instructed us in the art of mosaics and then in December, just in time for decorating the Christmas tree, Pam Gray held a bauble-making Workshop.


includes beverages for the afternoon and money for the charity pot. We have a lot of fun! Come join us!




Book Club






Many new friendships have been made as we walk and talk in this most beautiful part of Shanghai and nearly RMB2,000 has been raised for our charities.















Drop-In Drinks

This year we continued to hold our ever-popular, last Friday of the month, Drop In Drinks events. Venues this year included The Apartment, The Hop Project, Co. Cheese, Cages, The Hai and The Beer Lady. We are always on the lookout for interesting venues so please get in touch if you know of anywhere suitable.

5. Community Outreach

The jewel in Brits Abroad's crown is its Community Outreach programme. Every jiao Brits Abroad raises from events goes to various worthwhile organisations in China. Our donations in this financial year went to Shanghai Sunrise, Hands of Hope, More Than Aware and Heart To Heart.

Shanghai Sunrise is a charity dedicated to breaking the cycle of poverty by creating access to education through sponsorships for under-privileged young people in Shanghai. We continued to sponsor the education of 3 **Shanghai Sunrise** students at an annual cost of RMB3,000 each.

Hands of Hope creates uniquely designed products to support the livelihood of women with disabilities in China. The lives of the women who do the sewing for these products are transformed through the provision of housing, technical training and a steady income. Our Christmas party raised RMB1,768 for this charity and they were also one of the vendors at the Meet and Greet coffee morning at Cottons in November, where our members got to see the excellent quality of the products they produce.

Heart To Heart is a charity which provides much-needed heart surgery and follow-up support to children.

Our Christmas party raised RMB14,800 which we have topped up to RMB30,000. As previously mentioned this will be donated to the charity at our AGM. We also collected gifts and clothing at the Christmas party which Heart To Heart distributes to families who live in harsher climates.

More than Aware is a Shanghai-born support group that has been empowering women to be proactive in the prevention and recovery of breast cancer since 2011. As previously mentioned, RMB9,640 was raised during our activities in

October, including at the breast cancer lunch, and this will be topped up to RMB20,000 and donated to the charity at the AGM.

"Temporary Change to Section 2.2 and 2.3 of the Constitution".

Given the extenuating circumstances related to Covid 19 and the impact that this has had on the wider community in Shanghai, the committee proposed a temporary change in membership terms for 2020/21. This proposal was presented to members who voted in support of a temporary change. The revised membership quotas for 2020/21 are agreed as 55% British citizens and 45% other nationalities. This temporary change of the constitution will be reviewed at the AGM.
